



- 165,000 sq. ft. Building Addition
- 600 car Parking Deck
- 4-acre Sculpture Garden



LOUISE B. AND J. HARWOOD COCHRANE ATRIUM
The Louise B. and J. Harwood Cochrane Atrium is a multi-level space designed to showcase a diverse range of art and architectural elements. The ground floor features a large, open-plan area with a polished tile floor, ideal for displaying large-scale sculptures and installations. A prominent feature is the glass display case, which houses a classical statue and a vase, providing a secure and well-lit environment for these artifacts. The upper level, accessible via a central staircase, offers a panoramic view of the atrium and is equipped with glass railings for safety and visibility. The space is illuminated by recessed ceiling lights, creating a bright and airy atmosphere. The architectural design emphasizes clean lines and functional spaces, ensuring that the art and architecture are the central focus of the experience.








-  North Gallery 7,000 SF

-  South Gallery 4,000 SF


Plan of new special exhibition galleries
