Why Change?

- Need to streamline administration to focus resources on program delivery
- Technology and societal expectations
- Reduced state funding
 - FY 2012 \$3.7M in Agency 229
 Including \$1M directed at Virginia Cooperative Extension (VCE) Restructuring
 - FY 2008 through FY 2012 \$6.6 M in Agency 229

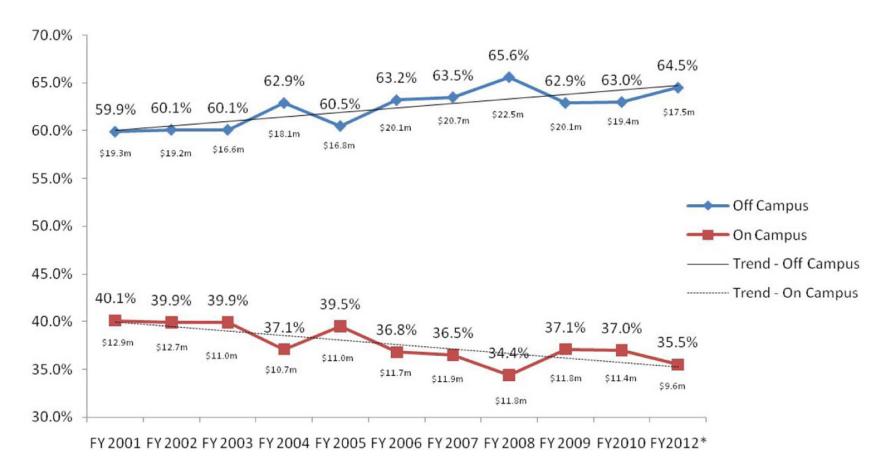

Distribution of State GF Resources Between Campus and Field Extension Activities Actual Expenditures FY 2001 through FY 2010 (FY 2012 projection)

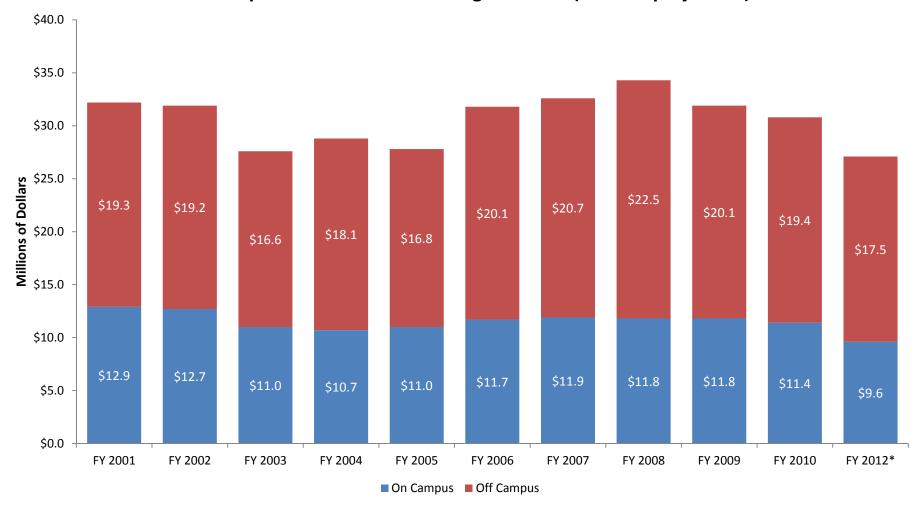

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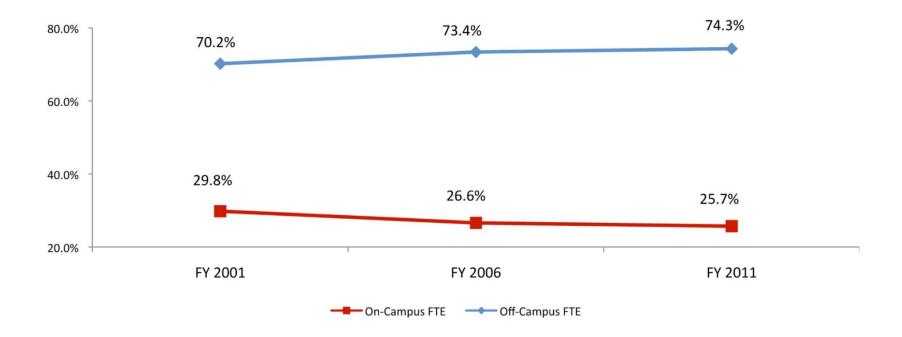


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Virginia Cooperative Extension Distribution of FTE On and Off Campus FY 2001, FY 2006, FY 2011

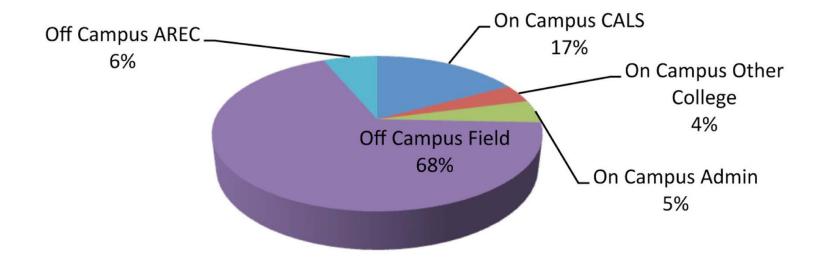








Virginia Cooperative Extension State and Federal FTE as of 11/1/2010

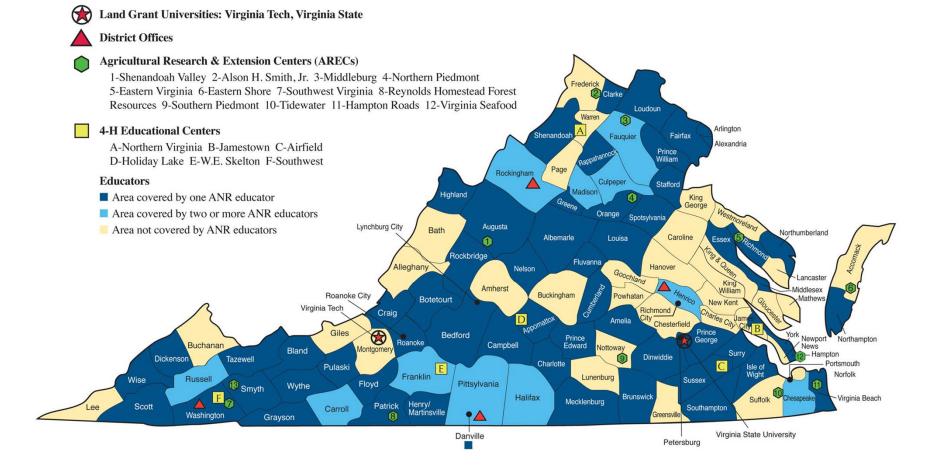


Total FTE Charged to Federal or State Virginia Cooperative Extension Funds on 11/9/2010 = 416.22





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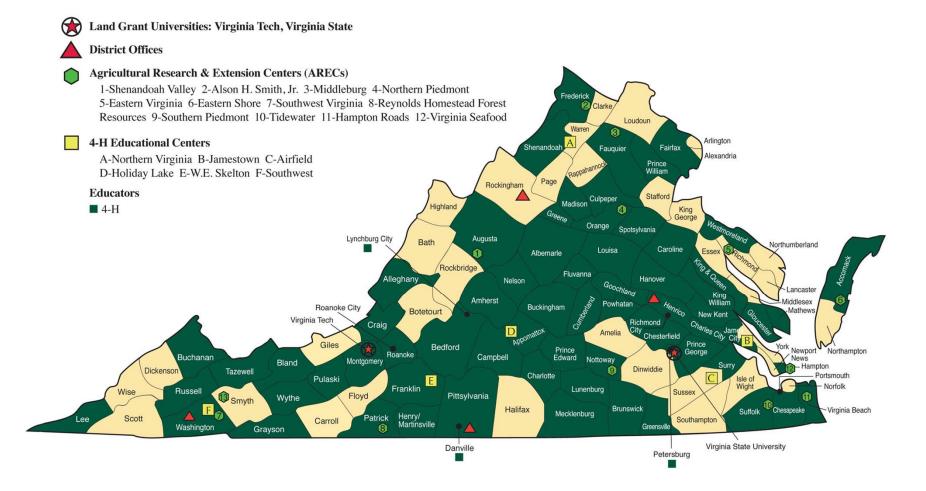








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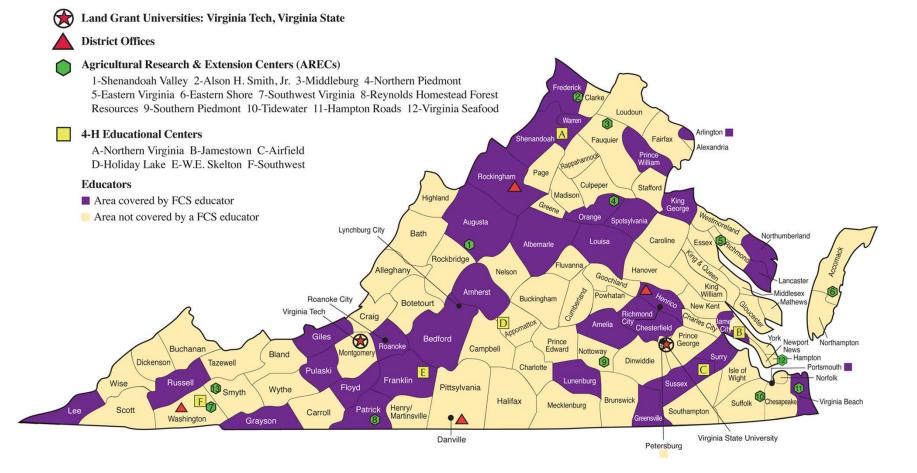








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Planning Process

- Strategic Planning Steering Committee
 - Initiated April 2009
 - Listening sessions across the state
 - 12,000 comments
 - Draft plan for comments Summer 2010
 - Finalized plan Fall 2010
- Restructuring Task Force
 - Initiated in Spring 2010





Strategic Plan Focus Areas

- Enhance the value of Virginia's agriculture
- Sustain natural resources and the environment
- Create a positive future through 4-H Youth Development
- Strengthen Virginia families and communities
- Cultivate community resiliency and capacity
- Organizational effectiveness





Restructuring Process

- Leadership Team recommendations
 - Maintain a local presence
 - Enhance campus/field interaction
 - Create efficiencies in the VCE delivery
 - Reduce administrative costs
 - Enhance relationships with key stakeholders
 - Eliminate duplicative programming
- Restructuring Task Force
 - 9-member Task Force assembled June 2010
 - Charged to engage stakeholders in developing recommendations for changing the structure of VCE





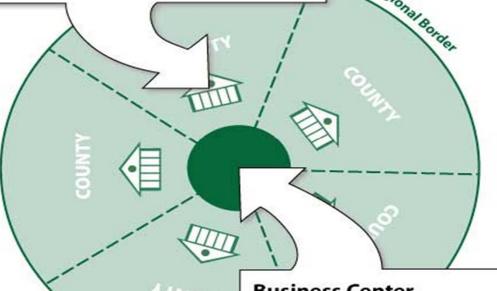


Regional Structure Option

Local Office

delivers local programs.

- 1 Co-funded Extension Educator
- 1 or more locally funded Extension Educators
- · 1 or more locally funded Assistant Extension Educators
- Some counties may choose to have no locally based Extension Educators.



Local Presence Plan

- NO additional funding requested
- Local offices will remain OPEN
- Regional sharing of agents currently exists and is widespread
- 22-27 business hubs will be developed in consultation with local governments and Extension staff

Business Center

provides operational hub and includes:

- 1 Unit Coordinator
- 1 Business Manager
- 1-3 Extension Educators (based on need)

Extension programs serve the region.





Personnel Management

- Increase collaboration among faculty and Educators in the field and to help define and develop Extension programs
- Streamline reporting lines
- Shift focus of district directors and unit coordinators to enhance relationships with local governments
- Support employees through professional development
- Study and revise compensation as needed





Next Steps

- We recognize that there has been insufficient communication and consultation with local government and stakeholders
- Over the next year, we will improve communication with local governments and stakeholders
- Begin to align programs with the strategic plan and form issue teams
- Develop systems to support greater collaboration with local government and stakeholders

- Include local presence and allow local government choice
- Include efficient administrative and managerial structure
