Higher Education Highlights

The Conference budget provides \$211.6 million for higher education compared to \$205.3 million in the introduced budget.

Public Colleges and Universities

- \$122.2 million for base operations, enrollment and incentive funding
 - \$50.9 million for base operations funding to address additional full-time faculty, operations & maintenance of new facilities, library, technology and utility costs
 - \$42.6 million for enrollment growth to include:
 - \$5.0 million to continue the growth toward 1,700 new in-state undergraduate seats at CWM, UVA, JMU & VT
 - \$23.6 million for in-state enrollment undergraduate growth and transfers
 - \$14.1 million to improve retention and graduation across the system
 - \$28.6 million for incentive funding linked to specific initiatives that support the goals of the TJ 21 legislation such as increased degree production especially in STEM-H, year-round use of facilities, and greater use of distance learning. Included in this are amounts to fund:
 - Logistics research partnership between, Longwood, UVA and VSU at Ft Lee
 - Programs at UVA, ODU and VT to increase STEM awareness and production
 - SySTEMic program at Northern Virginia CC
 - Virginia VIEW program at Virginia Tech
- Requires institutions to reallocate existing resources of \$17.3 million or 1.5% in FY 13 and \$23.1 million or 2% in FY 14 toward meeting the programs outlined in each institution's six-year academic plan and the goals of TJ 21

- Provides \$16.5 million for a 2% salary faculty increase in FY 14 at public colleges and universities
 - An additional \$0.9 million is provided for VIMS and extension programs at VT and VSU
- \$10.5 million for targeted research including:
 - \$3.0 million for UVA cancer research
 - \circ \$3.0 million for VCU cancer research
- \$18.5 million for in-state under graduate and graduate financial aid
- \$10.5 million of auxiliary enterprise interest earnings are restored
- \$5.0 million for other specific operating items including:
 - \$1.2 million for operating the UMW-Dahlgren higher education center
 - \$0.5 million to address unique military activities at VMI and the VT Corps of Cadets
 - \$0.5 million for a new pharmacy compounding lab at VCU
 - \$1.0 million at the VCCS for non-credit instruction costs related to workforce development

Other Higher Education

- \$1.1 million for operating support at VIMS
- \$1.0 million to hire new extension agents
- \$7.1 million for operating support at EVMS
- Increased operating support at higher education centers
 - \$1.2 million at the Inst. for Advanced Research (Danville)
 - \$0.5 million for the So. Va. Higher Educ Ctr (South Boston)
- Full restoration of budget reductions for the Virginia Women's Institute for Leadership at Mary Baldwin
- \$11.7 million to increase TAG grants to nearly \$2,800
- \$3.0 million equipment upgrade at Jefferson Labs
- Over \$118 million in allocations from the Higher Education Equipment Trust Fund (HEETF)
 - Includes \$18 million in research-related equipment
