FY'16 Operating Deficit Resolution

CIT made good progress in FY'16 to address an operating shortfall

- Recap in Jan '16, disclosed projected \$800K YE operating deficit
- Took actions to reduce deficit without disruption to key programs and meet contractual obligations
- YE FY '16 results: deficit stands at **\$90K**; will give back **\$710K** of \$800K
- Instituted long term governance and structural changes for the future

Long Term Governance and Structural Changes

Rolled FY'16 reductions forward and made additional reductions

- Governance new Board leadership and enhanced committees
 - Executive, Finance, Compensation (new), Policy (new)
- Fringe benefits multi-year reductions in retirement plan, medical plan and elimination of other non-health related benefits
- Compensation eliminated At Risk Incentive Compensation payout in FY'17; cancelled across the board pay increases for FY'17
- Additional restructuring to come throughout FY'17 to ensure operating and financial stability



Recent Mission Related Highlights

CIT continues to meet its mission on behalf of the Commonwealth

- CRCF: record applications in FY'16; 66% increase from FY'15; 48 awards totaling \$3.4M to private companies and university researchers
- GAP: 18 new investments in FY'16; Zoomdata example: From 12 to 120 VA jobs; Goldman Sachs and CIA investments
- MACH37: 13 companies launched in FY'16; total portfolio created 122 new cyber jobs to date
- Regional Outreach: greater presence in all regions; UVA-Wise/MACH37 program for employment in SW VA is an example of outcomes
- Broadband: Assisted a 20 localities and 4 regions on assessments and implementation plans;
 successful launch of RUOnlineVA
- R&D: UAS, Smart Cities, Federally Funded Accelerators work bringing external funding and innovation leadership to Commonwealth
