RESULTS OF THE FISCAL YEAR 2007 TEACHER SALARY SURVEY

Presented to the House Appropriations Subcommittee on Elementary and Secondary Education

JANUARY 16, 2007

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Teacher salaries are projected to continue to grow in the current fiscal year.

- The table below portrays the actual average teacher salaries reported to the Department of Education for fiscal years 2005 and 2006 with the rate of change in the actual average salary reported to be 4.08 percent statewide.
- For fiscal year 2007, school divisions have reported salary information that indicates the average budgeted salary will increase by an additional 4.25 percent statewide.
- For purposes of this presentation, Brunswick County data is included in the average salary calculations. When the "2006-2007 Teacher Salary Survey Results" report was submitted to the General Assembly in December 2006, Brunswick County data was not yet available, thus the information in the legislative report and this presentation may vary slightly.

Southern Regional Education Board (SREB) Comparison of Average Teacher Salaries, 2005-2006


