## Results of the 2008-2009 Teacher Salary Survey

# Presented to the House Appropriations Subcommittee on Elementary and Secondary Education 

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## Teacher salaries are projected to continue to grow in the current fiscal year:

- The appropriation act requires the Superintendent of Public Instruction to provide an annual report on the status of teacher salaries.
- The table on the next slide shows the actual average teacher salaries (including librarians and guidance counselors) reported to the Department of Education for fiscal years 2007 and 2008 with the rate of change in the actual average salary reported to be 2.81 percent statewide.
- For fiscal year 2009, school divisions have reported salary information that indicates the average budgeted salary will increase by an additional 2.75 percent statewide.

## Virginia's average teacher salary calculation differs from NEA methodology:

- There is a difference between the average salary calculation used by the National Education Association (NEA) and the average salary calculation used in the DOE Annual Salary Survey Report.
- The NEA average teacher salary includes instructional classroom teachers, substitutes, and homebound instructional teachers.
- The average teacher salary that is calculated and published in the DOE's Annual Salary Survey Report includes all positions included in the NEA average salary except substitutes, but also includes guidance counselors, librarians, instructional technology positions, and supplemental salary expenditures.
