





Current Virtual Virginia Enrollments


9,920 students, in 115 school divisions, taking 11,564 course enrollments from 62 teachers*.





Partnership with local school divisions



VVa Provides:

- Virtual course(s)
- VA-licensed and highly qualified instructor
- Instructional delivery systems
- Administrative and technical support
- Student support services liaison
- Advanced Placement exam reimbursement

Local School Division Continues to Provide:

- On-site mentor
- Counseling, health and social services, school psychologist
- Extracurricular activities
- Technology
- Supplemental face-to-face courses
- Federal programs (English Speakers of Other Languages, Title I, Free/Reduced Lunch)
- Special education services



Virtual Virginia Instruction

What instruction "looks like":

Location/Logistics:

• Students work from local school or from home



- Mentor provides face-to-face progress monitoring, test proctoring, and general support
- Mentor is a liaison between school, student, and VVa
- Mentor can be parent or school staff member
- Students can take combination of face-to-face courses from local school and virtual courses from VVa

Virtual Instruction:

- Readings, simulations, interactive practice, videos, and audio
- Virtual course discussions
- Whole group, small group, and individual instruction
- Real-time assistance and communication with instructors
- Combination of self-paced work and deadlines from teacher




Virtual VA Enrollment Process

Virtual Virginia Budget \$4,533,807.00




Costs on Average:

\$4,533,807.00 / 11,564 enrollments = **\$392.06 per course enrollment**


\$4,533,807.00 / 9,920 students = **\$457.04 per student**

Virtual Virginia Full-Time Pilot

- Program development fulfilling local needs
- Additional graduation opportunities for students
- Continued cost savings to all school divisions
- Existing funds continue to serve supplemental students
- 16.5 percent of full-time program course enrollments are part-time (supplemental) students



Current Virtual Virginia (VVa) Full-Time (Grades 9-12) Pilot Program Enrollment

Currently, 68 students, in 51 high schools, throughout 36 school divisions, taking 370 course enrollments.



Expansion of VVa Full-Time Pilot Program

VVa Current Math Outreach **Pilot Program: Algebra I**

Asynchronous lessons and resources:

- Recordings of live lessons
- Slide presentations of lessons

- Available to any Virginia teacher (via eMediaVA)
- VDOE able to track views and downloads of lessons and resources



Expansion of Math Outreach Pilot Programs: Addition of Algebra II and Geometry

- Year One: \$260,000
- Year Two: \$330,000
- 4 teachers total: 2 Algebra I, 1 Algebra II, & 1 Geometry
- Curriculum development and updates
- All other costs related to technical systems covered by \bullet VVa technical services contract




eMediaVA Content

- 31 content providers





Funding of eMediaVA

- Originally funded by WHRO
- Additional state funding in the amount of \$400,000 per year started in 2011
- Restoration of cut state funding needed

Multidivision Online Providers (MOPs)

Multidivision Online Providers (MOPs) supply online courses to K-12 students across multiple school divisions.



- 22 currently approved MOPs
- Local school divisions, private organizations, or nonprofit organizations
- Offer one or more courses
- Supply Virginia-licensed online instructor
- Local mentor from school may support learning
