

MEDICAID EXPANSION

WELCOME TO COVER VIRGINIA

The Commonwealth of Virginia is the 33rd state, along with the District of Columbia, to approve Medicaid expansion under the Affordable Care Act. Covernor Ralph Northam signed a new state budget into law on June 7rd that will take effect January 1, 2019. Essentially, the new law will expand eligibility to adults earning up to 138 percent of the federal poverty level, or less than \$17,000 a year, and a waiver to impose conditions on recipients, including a work requirement.

The Commonwealth has launched an outreach campaign called "Cover Virginia" to increase awareness and optimize enrollment. To assist local agencies in this endeavor, a Medicaid Expansion HUB (MExHUB) has been created to support state and local agencies.

Check the MEXHUB often for tools and resources that can be utilized to assist local agencies when answering questions received from the community and stakeholders. Additional information pertaining to Medicaid Expansion is also available at www.Coven/A.org.

What's changing

- . Up to 400,000 more adults living in Virginia will have access to quality, low-cost health coverage.
- Virginians aged 19 64 will be able to visit their doctor for help with preventing illness and improving their health.
- People working in retail, construction, childcare, landscaping, food service or other jobs that do not offer health insurance may be eligible for this low-cost health insurance in Virginia.



Medicaid Expansion Hub (MedEx)

The HUB has list of tools and resources to assist local agencies in learning about the changes and eligibility requirements for Medicaid Expansion scheduled to become effective January 1, 2019.









Goals

- Provide frequent, coordinated communications to interested stakeholders.
- Promote message discipline through intentional coordination and establishment of authoritative sources.
- Empower interested stakeholders to relay the coordinated message to their networks, achieving a scale not otherwise available to state government.

Accomplishments/Efforts

- Established series of constant contact emails to over 1,000 community partners (included brochures/posters/FAQ)
- Conduct In-Person Trainings and Webinars



Training Plan

Target Audience

- VDSS Medicaid Consultants and LDSS trainers
- BP Specialists (those that are currently processing Medicaid applications and renewals)
- CoverVA & VDSS Enterprise Call Center staff

Marketing

- Survey to determine number of workers and in-house trainers from each agency will require training.
- Announced via numerous communication channels and tracked through Virginia Learning Center.

Training Paths

• Multiple training paths are planned to include eLearning, webinars, User Group forums, face to face classroom opportunities across each region.



Funding for the equivalent of 300 new local eligibility workers

 Estimated New ME dollars for LDSS in FY 2019 = \$21.5 million

• Federal Share = \$16 million



- The Training, Enrollment, Engagement, Employment and Opportunity Program
 - An estimated 125,000 individuals will be subject to community engagement activities
 - An estimated 70,000 individuals will need to be placed in a work activity because they are unemployed
 - Eligibility process determines who must participate in TEEOP
 - LDSS workers must track compliance with hours of participation (VACMS is system of record)



- The Training, Enrollment, Engagement, Employment and Opportunity Program
 - Expansion participants enrolled in SNAP/TANF will meet their community engagement through those programs
 - Up to 2.4 million hours of work activity need to be provided
 - Collaborate with workforce partners to meet the work activity needs
