

The Virginia Career Pathways for Early Childhood and Out-of-School Time Practitioners recognizes the hours of informal training, formal education and credentials of practitioners in the field of Early Childhood and School-Age Care. The purpose of the Career Pathways is to help practitioners plan their training, education and career development goals so they may be well-prepared to educate, nurture and meet the needs of young children and their families. Although Career Pathways establishes a clear pathway to professional growth, it does not guarantee employment nor employee placement.

Practitioners will be awarded a Professional Development Certificate (Career Pathway Level 1-9 designation) when they successfully demonstrate proof of their education and credentials through the IMPACT registry.
